MEMBERSHIP NEEDED

The residents of the rural areas have proven they want Fire Protection. As you can see our membership for '62 was 180. Our goal for '63 is to increase this by 50 new members. At the rate our district is growing we can possibly increase this by more. You can help by sending your membership dues in and asking your neighbors to join.

Remember our membership runs from January to January.

All contributions to this department are deductible on your Income Tax.

A SAVINGS TO YOU

Before we organized, the town of Cary offered to furnish fire protection to us for \$6,310 per year. Our budget for 1963 is \$4,950.00 or a savings for this year of \$1,360.

The Fire Insurance Rating Bureau has approved a 9A Classification for our district. The savings for the average home owner on fire insurance in our district will more than offset the cost of membership in cooperation.

FIRE STATION

The rent on the Fire Station is \$50.00 per month. The first years rent was paid by J. M. Maxwell of Maxwell Insecticide Co. J. M. Maxwell has served on the Board of Directors since its organization and is treasurer of the department.

OUR FIRST BIRTHDAY

On December 1, 1962, we celebrated our first birthday. As you recall, we had to organize a new department to have fire protection in the rural area. Our Department started with a tanker truck given to us by the Cary Fire Department. Since then we have purchased a new American LaFrance pumper and built another tanker. Our units can carry 3,000 gallons of water to any point accessible in the YRAC District. The Department began with the International truck and a bank balance as shown in the financial statement and now the Departments value is approximately \$20,000.

All three trucks have two-way radios tied in with the Wake County network. This network is operated by Central Fire Station in Raleigh and gives us 24 hour automatic alarm service.
