Last week Lee Wilson paid a visit to Lillington, to photograph their two antique (and well-preserved) antique engines. The older one is a 1928 GMC/American LaFrance Type 99 triple combination, #G-125. (Shipped on June 27, 1928, says the [Peckham database](#).) With 500 GPM pump and 80 gallon tank. Cost \$6,500. The newer one is a 1951 Ford/Seagrave pumper. (Model? Specs?) Both are housed in the former Lillington Rescue Squad building. (The squad was chartered in 1968, say state corporation records.
