That's one of two Oshkosh/Pierce Tactical Fire Fighting Trucks that the National Guard has here. It's is built on an Oshkosh HEMTT chassis. Some specs, from a <u>brochure on the official site</u>: 210-inch wheelbase, all-wheel drive, 445-HP engine, 400-mile cruising range, 48-inch fording clearance, six-person capacity, five with SCBA, 1,000-gallon tank, 2,000-feet of hose, 1,000-GPM bump, roof and bumper remote-controlled turrets, numerous compartments and many tools, including hydraulic rescue equipment.
