Following is a report of the activities of the Chapel Hill Fire Department for the period June 25th to July 23rd, 1951.

- June 25th 7:50 P.M. Call to 210 E. Rosemary St. Street lighting circuit broken and wire on ground bubbling. No damage to property.
- July 12th 10:40 A.M. Call to Daniels Road, Victory Village. Carbon fire. No Alarm sounded. Damage to car about \$12.00
- July 12th 3:50 P.M. Call to new Luthern Church. Roof on fire, caused by Welders. Damage about #25.00 200 ft 2 1/2" hose used.
- July 19th 6:45 P.M. Call to Carolina Coffee Shop, E Franklin St. Stove on fire. No Damage. No Alarm.
- July 23rd 3:10 P. M. Call to Univ Service Station, Car on fire. No Alarm. No Damage.

At a meeting of the fire department held on July 20th the following men were elected to serve and as delegates and alternates to the Firemen's Convention to be held at Caroling Beach, N. C. on Aug. 21-22-23. C. E. Vashaw Delegate, C. L. Merritt Delegate, J. Thayer Lloyd Alternate, and Phillip Andrews Alternate. I understand that we have a traveling fund of \$150.00. The last convention that was held at Carolina Beach we were allotted the amount of \$35.00 per man or not to exceed \$200.00. If all five men go to the convention this year and they are allotted \$35.00 each it will be a total of \$175.00 needed instead of \$150.00 set up. I am asking the board to allot this extra \$25.00 for the convention. Please let me hear from you as to the extra allocation, if it is allowed by the Board of Aldermen.
