

CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA

harlotte is an American history book as well as a modern trend-setting metropolis. The largest city of the Carolinas, Charlotte captures the spirit of the South and has excitement and adventure for everyone. If you are shopping for the best in Charlotte, the Overstreet Shopping Mall is a combination of 52 shops and restaurants and is conveniently located next to the Radisson Hotel. A visit to the Latta Arcade, the first mall in the country, is a chance to see a charming period re-creation. The churches of Charlotte reflect varying styles of art and architecture. St. Peter's Episcopal Church, which is located on North Tryon Street, was built in the late 1820's and has since been restored to its original appearance. Settler's Cemetery, just behind the First Presbyterian Church, on W. 5th Street, is a memorial to the founding settlers of Mecklenburg County. Be on the lookout for small brass markers along Trade and Tryon Streets that indicate the various landmarks of historical Charlotte. To sample a portion of the modern Charlotte, the Discovery Place on North Tryon Street encourages hands-on participation in its scientific and technological displays. Entrance fees are reasonable with reduced rates for children. Current exhibits include About Faces, designed to show us there is more to the face than first meets the eye, by utilizing recent developments in computer technology, and Oceans of Promise, which looks at our reliance upon and interdependence with the seas around us for many of our daily needs. Fourth Ward Park, between Pine and Poplar Streets, not only affords views of historical, turn-of-the-century homes, but also gives a bit of peace and tranquility after a full day of activity. If you have not already received your Uptown Charlotte map, please pick one up in the lobby of the Convention Center.



Special SpouseTours

The Charlotte Convention and Visitors Bureau will be on hand to answer any questions you may have regarding this exciting Southern city and to assist you in planning your activities, many within walking distance of the Convention Center. The nearby "Walk Through Historic 4th Ward" is a self-guided walking tour that winds through this charming restored area filled with a colorful past. Many buildings in this district are listed on the city and state historical registers.







The Expo South Parade, featuring over 75 pieces of apparatus, begins at 12:15 p.m. at the corner of West Tenth Street and North Tryon Street. It moves down Tryon past Discovery Place and the Marriott Hotel. North Tryon Street is an especially good vantage point to see all the action. Continuing several more blocks, it turns onto East Third Street for several blocks, continues down Brevard Street and makes a final left turn as it travels down East Second Street. The parade will continue on Second Street, and wind up adjacent to the Adam's Mark Hotel, where the Flea Market and Competitive Muster will be held.

The Flea Market begins at 9:30 a.m. and continues throughout the day. The Competitive Muster begins at 2:30 p.m. and features twelve teams from all over the South competing in precision events designed to test speed and skill. They include the Quick Dress Event, the Burning Building Event, Hose Roll, and Master Stream Attack. Prizes will be awarded both for the winning teams and for the winning Parade rigs at 5:30 p.m. from the judges reviewing stand.

Safety is a very important concern at the Parade and Competitive events. One accident can spoil an entire day of fun. As you go about, please be observant of moving vehicles, streams of water, children climbing on vehicles, and please give our competitive teams ample space in which to work.
