- IMPORTANT: You are required to observe the following BY-LAWS of the State Association and Concolidated Statutes of North Carolina.
- PER-CAPITA TAX TO BE PAID: You are required to pay your per-capita tax on or before January 1st. each year. BY-LAWS, Article II. Section 1.
- REPORT TO BE FILED: You are required to report to the Insurance Commissioner each year on or before October 31st. on blank furnished by the Insurance Commissioner, the condition of your fire fighting equipment, etc., Consolidated Statutes, Section 6071.
- TO SEND REPRESENTATIVE TO ANNUAL MEETING: You are required to send a representative to the annual meeting of the State Association. Consolidated Statutes, Section 6072.
- TO FILE REPORT OF THE FIREMEN'S RELIEF FUND: The Treasurer of the Board of Trustees of your local Relief Fund is required to make report of the condition of the fund for each year ending June 30th., to the Secretary of the State Association on blank furnished from his office. Consolidated Statutes, Section 6070.
- WHEN THESE REQUIREMENTS ARE MET: When these requirements are met you will be in good standing with the State Association, and will have complied with all Statutes relative to the Firemen's Relief Fund, disbursed by the Insurance Commissioner's Office.
