



# Tompkins Hall (1914)

- Controlled ~5:00 a.m.
- Steamer, hose wagons, plus college hose streams.
- Loss \$80,000.















- July 3, 1928.

- Loss over \$200,000.






















# © City Auditorium (1930)


- October 24, 1930.

- Loss \$84,600.



















































- 2 stories, built 1890-1900.
